Avocado	25x30	25-26	May-Feb, check variety
Barbados Cherry	12x12	28-29	May-Nov mostly, sweet to sub-acid, extremely high vitamin C
Banana	8x4	29-30	Year round, fruit once then produce suckers for next crop
Black Sapote	25x25	28-30	Fall and spring, known as chocolate pudding fruit
Carambola	12x12	26-28	Aug-March, fruit very prolifically
Coffee	6x4	28-30	Bright indirect light, winter, dry roast and grind
Fig	10x10	20-27	Spring and winter
Goji berry	12x4	Negative 18	Year around full sun
Green Sapote	20x20	25-27	Spring and summer, creamy pumpkin pie taste
Grumichama	18x12	28-30	Spring, similar to Jaboticaba
Guava	15x15	25-26	Year around heavy producers
Jaboticaba	18x12	25-27	Year around, grape like fruit, likes a lot of water
Jujube	10x10	25-26	Dec-March, texture and flavor of an apple
Longan	25x25	24-28	July-Sept, brown shell, quarter size sweet fruit
Loquat	15x15	22-23	Jan-April, combination of peach and apricot flavor
Lychee	25x25	24-28	May-June, reddish shell, passion fruit and grape flavor
Mango	15x15	25-27	May-Jan, check variety
Mulberry	40x40	22-23	Long fruiting season, 3 to 4 inch long fruit
E. Mulberry	15x15	22-23	Year round, small fruit
Olive	25x25	22-23	Late summer-fall, typically cured in a brine solution
Persimmon	15x15	Negative 25	late fall-early winter, sweet fruit
Sapodillia	20x20	28-29	Dec-Oct, tastes like a pear soaked in brown sugar
Surinam Cherry	15x15	26-27	Sweet-tart acidic flavor
Strawberry Tree	20x20	28-30	Year round, blueberry size fruit, flavor similar to crunch berry
Sugar Apple	15x10	28-29	Aug-Nov, taste like sugary sweet custard
Tamarind	25x25	28-29	Tart/sweet, 6 to 8 long fruit
White Sapote	20x15	24-25	May-July, tastes like a creamy sugar cube, baseball size fruit

Citrus	Notes
Lemons	
Eureka	Mostly fall/winter, sour tangy flavor, commercial variety
Meyer	Mostly fall/winter, sweeter than common lemon
Variegated pink	Mostly winter/spring, fruit is variegated and pink inside
Limes	
Key	Mostly late spring/early summer, less tart and more seeds than Persian
Thone less Key	Same as above just no thorns
Persian	May-June & Nov-Dec, more acidic than key limes
Sweet	Late fall to early spring, turns yellow when ripe low acidity
Kaffir	All year, not cold tolerant, not very juicy, people use the leaves more than the fruit
Giant Finger	Oct-Mar, also called Caviar lime, very thorny tree
Red Finger	Same just dark red color

Flame	Sept-April, very juicy, few or no seeds, large fruit, more cold hardy than most reds
Ray Red	Oct-April, Originated from Ruby Red, drought hardy
Thompson Pink	Oct-Mar, medium juicy fruit, cold hardy, few or no seeds, offshoot of Marsh
Hirado Pomelo	Nov-Feb, very thick skin, pink flesh, chewy texture, moderately juicy

Blood	Dec-April, less tangy, more floral fruit flavor, few seeds, anti cancer properties
Cara Cara	Oct-Jan, low acidity, contains more vitamin C and A than other navels, seedless
Hamlin	Nov-Dec, large and easy peel, top juice orange, low acid, most cold tolerant
Page	Oct-Feb, one of the sweetest Est flavorful varieties, cold tolerant
Valencia	March-June, juicy, sweet, somewhat cold tolerant
Clemintine	Dec-Jan, thin skin, sweeter than most other citrus, typically seedless
Minneola Tangelo	Dec-Feb, also called Honeybell, thin skin, easy peel
Ponkan Tangerine	Dec-Feb, very sweet, semi-thick skin, easy peel, few seeds
Satsuma Mandarin	Oct-Dec, seedless, easy to peel, loose skin
Temple	Jan-March, med-large fruit, spicy-sweet flavor, easy to peel and segment, generally seedless
W Murcott - Honey Tangerine	Jan-Mar, alternate bearing, super sweet, easy to peel and separate, generally seedless
Melwa	Dec - March, cold tolerant, sweeter and rounder
Nagami	Dec - March, cold tolerant, oblong and tart inside
Centennial	Dec - March, sweet and tangy, not sour

Lemon meringue	Early	Small bright yellow fruit, sweet lemony
Nam Doc Mai	Mid	Compact tree, Thailand favorite
Neelum	Late	S. India desert mango, sour, eaten green
Peach Cobbler	Mid/Late	Delicious peach - cinnamon flavor
Pina Coloda	Mid	Small fruit, pineapple-coconut flavor
Valencia pride	Mid	Large and colorful fruit, fast growing tree
